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Training January 2015 - December 2017

513 people have completed training and developed new skills



15 volunteers and 4 staff members have completed certificated training

15 individuals have taken new skills to new paid or voluntary roles in other projects





406 volunteers have supported others and shared skills through peer **learning and volunteering**

15,500 learning hours have been delivered through Peregrini Lindisfarne
